

Notable Laws of the Roman Republic

Lex, legis, f. = law

- 494 B.C. – Lex Sacrata – creates the office of tribune (result of 1st secession of plebs)
- 445 B.C. – Lex Canuleia – allows intermarriage of plebeians and patricians (2nd secession)
- 367 B.C. – Lex Licinia-Sextia – allows one consul to be plebeian (3rd secession)
- 287 B.C. – Lex Hortensia – all resolutions passed by plebeians are binding on all citizens (5th)
- 90 B.C. – Lex Iulia – Offers citizenship to Italians from communities which had not raised armies against Rome in the Italian War
- 89 B.C. – Lex Plautia Papiria – Citizens of Italian communities which had rebelled against Rome now granted Roman citizenship
- 67 B.C. – Lex Gabinia – gives Pompey command against the pirates
- 66 B.C. – Lex Manilia – gives Pompey command against Mithridates (had been Lucullus's command)
- 43 B.C. – Lex Titia – legalized the 2nd Triumvirate
