Cicero Urges Catiline to Depart

Quae cum ita sint, Catilīna, perge, quō coepistī, ēgredere aliquandō ex urbe; patent portae; proficīscere. Nimum diū tē imperātōrem tua illa Mānliāna castra dēsīderant. Ēdūc tēcum etiam omnēs tuōs, sī minus, quam plūrimōs; purgā urbem. Magnō mē metū līberābis, dum modo inter mē atque tē mūrus intersit. Nōbīscum versārī iam diūtius nōn potes; nōn feram, nōn patiar, nōn sinam.

Cicero, *In Catilīnam* I, 5

Therefore, Catiline, keep going where you have begun to go, finally get out of the city; the gates are open, leave! Too long that camp of yours under Manlius has desired you as its commander. Lead out with you also all your followers, if less, as many as possible; clean out the city. You will free me from great fear provided that there may be a wall between me and you. You cannot linger with us any longer. I won't tolerate it, I won't endure it, I won't permit it.
